ESI announces \$500,000 Scholarship Program for Project Management Training to Help Unemployed in USA

ESI International has announced the launch of a \$500,000 scholarship program for out-of-work technical professionals. Scholarship funds will cover the majority of U.S. course fees for approved candidates, who may choose up to three courses from ESI's project management or business analysis curriculum.

Courses can be completed at any ESI U.S. public classroom, or via any ESI online learning platform. ESI's Stand Out Scholarship will run through Dec. 31, 2009 or until funds have been exhausted. The program is limited to currently unemployed individuals who are U.S. citizens or permanent residents who show acceptable proof of unemployment.
